Because of the **SRI**, I did not have the opportunity to teach the Works Cited skill before the due date of your **Compound Prepositional Phrases Project**. Therefore, beginning on the second page here, I have typed three MLA Works Cited pages---three versions of the sources that I gave to you on your September 4 (A) / September 5 (B) assignment sheets. Feel free to recopy the one you need to complete your project; <u>however</u>, ensure that your font size is consistent throughout the project you submit for grading.

- If you used all three of the sources---the grammar textbook, the *EnglishClub.com* site, and the *Grammar.com* site--- scroll down and use the Works Cited on page two here.
- If you only used the textbook and the *Grammar.com* site, scroll down and use the Works Cited on page three here.
- If you only used the two websites---the *Grammar.com* site and the *EnglishClub.com* site---scroll down and use the Works Cited on page four here.

Also, be sure to capitalize, italicize, punctuate, spell, indent, and space **exactly** as I have on the models. After each punctuation mark within each source, hit the space bar once. In addition to the other punctuation marks, every source must end with a period.

## NOTE

- Only center the title at the top. Begin typing on the top line. Also, type the title exactly as I have typed it.
- The first line of each source must start at the left margin. However, after the first line, you must indent every other line of that source. (This is the exact opposite of how paragraphs are indented.)
- Each new source again must begin at the left margin.
- Avoid inserting extra spacing between each source.
- The entire page must be double-spaced from the title at the top of the page to the last line of the last source you include
